## Every child wins at MAM's Summer Academy

Last summer, Jaylon, age 10, came to the MAM Grizzlies Center every day five days a week. Nicole, age 12, came to the MAM Olivet Center five days a week. And along with Jaylon and Nicole, 400 other third to eighth grade boys and girls came all summer long to these two centers - and three more - for one reason only, MAM's Summer Academy.

Summer Academy is "hard to describe," according to Jaylon. "Summer Academy is not just playing sports, but a bunch of fun things that keep me busy and out of trouble. It's learning about Jesus. It's reading books about different countries. It's meeting nice people and going to places all over Memphis, and pretty much, well, it's just the best summer ever."

Nicole liked Summer Academy for another reason. "At home, I watch TV or play on my phone all day while my mom is at work. At Summer Academy, the teachers help me think, so I don't forget what I learned at school."

MAM's Summer Academy began in 2007 as an outreach summer program to serve the youth who participate in MAM programs during the school year. Approximately 50 sixth and seventh grade boys attended the first camp at the MAM Grizzlies Center. Continued success resulted in the 2017 camp serving approximately 300 boys and girls from third to eighth grade from all over Memphis. The 2018 Summer Academy will serve 460 children at five locations.



This year's academy will include Bible lessons, games and competitions, science, art, math, reading and once a week field trips. It will run five days a week, from June 4 through July 24, 7:30 am to 6:00 pm.

"Educators report that a student's learning slips during the summer. We want to stop that trend," states Ginny Windsor, MAM Academic Director. "And during the summer, what better way to learn than through fun, active games with your friends. At MAM's Summer Academy, every child wins."

# MAM Insights from the President: Why we do Summer Academy

This time of year, our kids are looking forward to the end of school and the beginning of summer break. My 13-year-old son Enoch is no exception; he is ready for summer to START NOW.

When I was a child, I didn't go away to camp, on church trips or family vacations during the summer. I didn't have many adult role models consistently spending time with me. My coach James Collinsworth opened the school gym every day, and I went to the local Boys and Girls Club every now and then.

At the gym, my coach would give me a box and tell me to pick up trash outside and around the gym before coming inside and before going home. I also had to sweep inside and out. Coach C wanted me to have "skin in the game." He was **coaching** me, **growing** me as a young man, and **leading** me in the right way.

Coach Collinsworth knew that if I wasn't at the gym, I was probably up to no good. He made sure that I was in the gym almost every day. Even though I spent most of my summer days under Coach C's guidance, I never did anything remotely related to schoolwork. I cannot remember EVER reading a single book over the summer, much less THINK about reading!

Many Memphis kids do not have a Coach C in their lives. And many do not have other adults who are there every day giving them supervision and structure throughout the summer months. We offer Summer Academy, so parents have a dynamic, fun, safe place for their kids to spend their summer days. Their kids spend their days reading, playing sports, learning life skills, and more, all with a gospel-centered focus.

Parents pay \$50.00 per child for the whole summer plus the cost of field trips. Just like Coach Collinsworth knew I needed, our parents and kids need to have "skin in the game."

Our vision for the summer is **each child finds IDENTITY in Christ, has HOPE restored and LIFE change.**

Fearing his safety, Jaylin’s mom kept him at home away from school and away from MAM for several days. I wanted to help but wasn’t sure what to do. That night I prayed and asked God for guidance. The next morning my wife Moriah, who knew nothing about the situation, told me God put it on her heart to make a meal for Jaylin! I was blown away. So, we cooked dinner for him and his family.



“On my way to deliver the meal, I wrestled on the best way to approach Jaylin about doing this week’s Bible study. Jaylin came to Bible study regularly, but he struggles with fully committing to live for God. I wanted him to know that I sincerely cared about him, not just that I wanted to ‘play preacher’ and read the Bible to him. I was still wrestling as I walked up the steps to his house. I don’t know why I ever doubted God. As soon as Jaylin opened the door, he hugged me and said “Coach, can I make up my Bible study since I didn’t come this week?” Once again, I was blown away and so thankful to God for working in Jaylin’s life! That was the most attentive I have ever seen Jaylin as he truly began to seek Jesus. It was amazing to see God working in Jaylin’s life.”
